Write-up Requirements and Judging

Please Submit with your Letter of Intent to Enter/Entry Form

The fundamental standard against which your write-up will be judged is: Could you or one of your friends take the write-up and, without any other help, build one of these devices for a paraplegic friend?

1. The description is to be between 600 and 1000 words in length and include a minimum of two graphics (JPG/JPEG only at resolution rate of 800 x 600 dpi or better).
2. Electronic submissions are required and must be sent to the designated judges in Adobe PDF format or in html format readable by a browser such as Internet Explorer, Netscape, etc.
3. The write-up must be submitted to the appropriate judging team 14 days ahead of the beginning of the contest, The exact deadline for each contest will be set by the local Chief Judge and will be posted on the web site as soon as available. Detailed instructions for write-up submissions will be posted on the web site for each regional contest no later than four weeks before the submission deadline.
4. Teams not submitting a description will be permitted to compete, but of course will start with a score deficit.
5. The judging team will insure that the descriptions will not be available to other design teams before the start of the contest, and will not be available to teams at other regions where the contest has not yet been conducted.

The language used in the write-up must be English, regardless of the native language of the competitors
